

Advisor Awards

Paragon Award for New Advisors - Advisors with less than four years of service as of January 10, 2018. An advisor may receive this award only once.

Distinguished Advisor Award - Advisors with at least four or more years of service as of January 10, 2018. An advisor may receive this award only once.

Continued Excellence Award for Advisors - Advisors must have already received the Distinguished Advisor Award. Once an advisor has received the Distinguished Advisor Award, he/she will be eligible for the Continued Excellence Award for Advisors the following year. Advisors are eligible to win this award every other year.

Award-winning advisors are those who make significant contributions to the growth of the individual members, serve as the chapter's advocate on campus, and encourage the chapter to be involved on the local, regional and/or international levels of the organization. Years of service will be based upon the advisor's start date reported to Phi Theta Kappa Headquarters.

The entry will be judged based on each individual question. Maximum score is 55 points.

CHAPTER NOMINATION: To be completed by a Chapter Officer or Current Member

- 1. Describe up to three examples of how the advisor contributed to the development of chapter members.**

10 points

Nominee made a significant and sustained contribution to the academic, personal and professional development of many members. Nominee continually provided opportunities for members to broaden their horizons, develop life skills, and prepare for future success.

7 points

Nominee played a significant role in the academic, personal and/or professional development of members.

4 points

An association exists between the nominee and members' academic, personal and/or professional development.

- 2. Give specific, detailed examples of the advisor's support of Phi Theta Kappa's primary mission to recognize academic excellence of college students, specifically as it relates to the chapter's membership recruitment efforts.**

10 points

Conducted at least two membership recruitment campaigns during the year. Organized membership recruitments that included but were not limited to: a) creating awareness of and enthusiasm for Phi Theta Kappa on campus among students and faculty, b) inviting eligible students, c) conducting orientation meetings about membership, d) holding an induction ceremony, and e) reporting members. Utilized Recruitment Brochures provided by headquarters and Recruitment Tools found on ptk.org.

7 points

Conducted at least one membership recruitment campaign during the year. Organized membership recruitment that included but was not limited to: a) inviting eligible students, b) conducting orientation meetings about membership, c) holding an induction ceremony, and d) reporting members.

4 points

Minimal membership recruitment. Invited students to join and reported members.

- 3. Describe up to three examples of how the advisor inspired chapter officers and members to develop a comprehensive Honors in Action project based on the Society's Honors Study Topic and to participate in chapter development activities (i.e., College Project, Competitive Edge, CollegeFish).**

10 points

Nominee coached officers and members as they developed a comprehensive Honors in Action project based on the Society's Honors Study Topic and inspired officers and members to participate in chapter development activities. Nominee enthusiastically participated with them frequently, continually motivated them, and consistently provided oversight to chapter activities.

7 points

Nominee inspired officers and members to develop an Honors in Action project based on the Society's Honors Study Topic and to participate in other chapter development activities. Nominee willingly participated with them, motivated them, and provided oversight.

4 points

Nominee inspired officers and members to develop chapter activities. Nominee regularly attended chapter meetings and/or activities, and helped guide chapter officers.

- 4. Describe up to three examples of how the advisor led the chapter to participate on the regional and/or international level.**

10 points

Nominee consistently encouraged the chapter's participation at the district, regional, and/or international level. Nominee enthusiastically campaigned for, sought out or took on a leadership role at the district, regional and/or international level. (Examples may include campaigning for regional office, hosting or co-hosting a district or regional conference, mentoring a fellow chapter, hosting a workshop at a regional event, etc.)

7 points

Nominee encouraged the chapter's participation at the district, regional, and/or international level. Nominee assumed a leadership role at the district, regional and/or international level.

4 points

Little or no details regarding the advisor encouragement of the chapter's participation at the district, regional, and/or international level.

COLLEGE NOMINATION: To be completed by the College President, Campus CEO, or Administrator.

Note: The College Nomination must be obtained in a PDF or Word document format which the chapter will upload in the online awards application.

1. Describe the advisor's contributions as an advocate for your college's chapter in the areas of awareness, funding, and visibility on campus and in the community.

10 points

Nominee consistently raised awareness of Phi Theta Kappa among students and faculty, regularly shared the chapter's accomplishments with the college administration, increased visibility on campus, and raised awareness about the need and advocated for funding for the chapter.

7 points

Nominee raised awareness among students and faculty, shared the chapter's accomplishments with the college administration, increased visibility on campus, and/or helped raise awareness about the need and advocated for funding for the chapter.

4 points

Some evidence that shows the nominee made a positive reference to Phi Theta Kappa, shared the chapter's accomplishments when given an opportunity, and/or supported efforts to secure funding for the chapter.

Presentation

5 points

Spelling and grammar are faultless.

3 points

A few errors in spelling and/or grammar.

1 point

Spelling and/or grammar errors throughout.
